Patients who had been prescreened at Hope, ready with a complete treatment plan, visited Woodland to have their treatment completed. The Woodland staff found the experience so rewarding that they wanted to volunteer their services again and ask other dental practices in Saline to consider joining them. Among the services provided were cleanings, fillings, crowns, root canals, periodontal therapy, and a full-mouth extraction provided by oral surgeon Dr.

At the office of Drs. Powell and Udrys, Dr. Jacqueline Coleman was thankful to have the opportunity to help. Her patient would have lost teeth if he hadn't received fillings at the Day of Caring. "We feel like we're really making a difference," said Dr. Coleman.

The front desk staff at Dr. James Olsen's office were similarly enthusiastic. They spoke of the great reception from the patients they served and how glad they were to be able to help. Kay Franziel, a hygienist at Pear Tree Dental, said "We feel good about doing this. We just think it's wonderful that Hope and our
